

A. Part of an old Roman tessellated Marble Pavement, found at Cloten, in the County of Kyburg, in the Canton of Lyric in June 1774, together with ^{the following} some other Roman antiquities.

B. B. Two medals, the first in brass of M. Aurelius, the other in silver of Valerianus, found along with some others at the same place.

C. C. Two of the tessellae as big as the Life.

D. E. F. Inscriptions on bricks.

G. H. Two pieces of earthen pipes, doubtless for conveying the water to this room, several lying together.

I. A Trochlea, baked, of earth, ~~with a kind of earth~~ with a kind of a wimble sticking in it.

K. An Iron key.

L. M. Two Knives, probably for sacrifices, both of ^{Iron}

N. A brass instrument, composed of three pieces moveable on a joint in the middle, one straight, the other two crooked. ~~It is not possible to describe it as a game because the description is too complicated~~

O. A Brass patera, with the handle.

These antiquities & as much of the pavement, as could be transported, ~~as was~~ saved, were sent to Zurich, by order of the Magistrate, & are now kept in the public Library there.
