Arundel mostly into art. Rubens of Arundel, "one of v evangelists of our art" (12).
friends of Lord Wm Howard of Naworth & Sir Robert Cotton (v also his mentor Wm Camden,
antiquarian). The 3 excavated a Roman wall to the north. The finds were incorporated
into v walls of Cotton's garden. A would also display items around his garden/courtyard.
Adds to collection from Europe, Turkey, Egypt. (12).
